# Department of North Carolina November-December Report Vice President/ Membership

Fall Conference is behind us and was very successful and informative. It was great to meet up with old friends and make new ones!

The North Carolina Express was chugging along, gathering membership wherever it goes. Fall Conference was no exception. In fact, it was very exceptional. The NC train engineers and passengers brought in 236 memberships from 21 units! This represented mostly renewal, with some new members as well.

The current Department strength rose to 58.62%. This places North Carolina in first place nationally. We are well on our way to meeting National's 75% challenge by December 7, 2023, Pearl Harbor Day. There are approximately 5 weeks to go, I know that we can do it!

The next Department challenge is that the units have all member renewaled by December 31, 2024. There will be a drawing at Mid-Winter Conference for those units that have met the challenge.

Here are some things to consider when submitting membership to the Department.

- 1 Use only the transmittal form with the numbered spaces, it was decided at the Finance meeting to decrease the paperwork going to the office.
- 2 List the names alphabetically. This makes it easier to enter the information into the computer.
- 3 For renewals, only the transmittal form needs to be sent in with the check. Make sure it reflects the current dues rates: \$28.50 for Seniors and \$8.50 for Juniors.
- 4 All applications must be signed by the applicant in the appropriate section. If they forget to sign the application, it will be returned.
- 5 The Post Adjutant must verify the eligibility of the applicant and sign the application.
- 6 Send only the completed properly filled out application to the Department office with the check. Do not send any other documents with new applications. Maintain the documents securely in your unit files. Remember that they contain sensitive information that should not be made public.

Many thanks to the Membership Team, the Division, District and Unit Presidents for their diligence in working on membership. Without actively engaged members we are not able to carry out our mission. Keep our Veterans, active-duty military and their families in your thoughts and prayers during this upcoming holiday season.

### Participation Requirements:

- Participants should be: a member of the **current junior class** of her high school and should be graduating in 2024, in the top 1/3 of her class (use your best judgement for students who do not have class rankings).
- Seek potential participants from public, private, and military schools as well as homeschool students in your area. Don't forget your local Early College High Schools!
- Participants **do not** have to be members of a JROTC program to be eligible to attend. Participants should have an interest in government and parliamentary procedure.
- The cost for the program will be \$400 per participant. Tuition checks should come directly from Units and should accompany the enclosed Endorsement Form! No personal checks should be sent to Department Headquarters.

# Application at the Unit Level & Program Registration:

- Recruit and select participants via an interview process of your choosing. Remember we are a nonpartisan program. Please ask students about their ability and willingness to be away from home for a week to commit to the program.
- We are asking that you verify GPA and Class Rank **BEFORE** giving the delegate the password to complete the online registration form. You can contact counselors directly or verify on a delegate's transcript.
- After she is selected by your unit, she must **register** with Department. Please try to avoid using the word application after this point, as they have already been vetted and accepted by your Unit. At this time, funds are collected from the girl, if necessary, and the delegate should be given the password, your Unit Number, and your contact information. She will contact you after she has completed the online registration.
- 2024 Password: explore2024
- After all chosen delegates have notified you of their completion of the registration form, please mail your
  check to Dept. Headquarters with the 2024 ALA THGS Endorsement Form. We recommend providing the
  delegate with a time frame to complete the registration form this allows time to verify that she has
  completed it with the ALATHGS committee before mailing your check to Headquarters.
  - Visit ALATHGS.com, Click 2024 Participants, and type in the password. The registration form will be available on this part of the website after January 15, 2024.

### 2023-2024 Timeline:

- Now: Begin contacting your local schools! A printable flyer to give to guidance counselors is available on our website under "Unit Information."


