"For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security."

Freedom is not Free! Our soldiers continue to fight for this freedom every day! And for this, I salute and thank every veteran! May God continue to Bless our Veterans, active-duty Military Service Members and their families!

My President's Project for 2023-2024 is "Veteran Suicide Awareness." My Slogan is: "See Something, Say Something," "Be the One" To Do Something!"

Today, the No.1 issue facing the veteran community is suicide. It is estimated that between 17 and 22 veterans or servicemembers take their lives each day. That is more than 6,000 annually. The rate of suicide for veterans is more than 50% higher than that of non-veteran adults!

I will be raising \$25,000, if not more, to support the 4 VA Hospitals in North Carolina: Durham, Fayetteville, Asheville, and Salisbury. In contacting each VA Hospital, the amount of money they received annually to help the mental health ward was less than \$1,000.

Let us be pro-active, if you see a veteran becoming despondent, capture his/her attention and start a conversation, anything other than being a veteran.

Remember: "See something, say something, Be the one, to do something."

It may behoove the District and Division Presidents to coordinate the fundraising efforts in their areas, to encourage cooperation among

the units. We do not want to have units deciding that the dues increase is what will cause them to close their doors.

We, on the membership team, will also be looking for posts who desire to have Auxiliary units. We should reach out to posts without Auxiliaries to ascertain if there is any interest in having a unit.

The efforts in recruiting new members these past several years has been noteworthy. We do not want to have these efforts be in vain.

My theme for this year is NC ALA is a train, ***The North Carolina Express***, traveling around the state raising awareness of organization, talking about what we do and why we do it. Having fun, working our mission out in our communities. We have found that partnering up with other organizations, benefits both and eligible members are likely to join us in working our mission.
